SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

In today's excerpt from A Forest of Symbols, Dom Barthe explains the significance of a room that unfamiliar to most Mass-goers: the sacristy. The sacristy is the place where many sacred articles are held. Indeed, the liturgical action itself finds its start here as well. This happens through the ministers' prayers of vesting and the prayers before and after Mass. The word sacristy comes from the Latin, *sacrarium*, meaning a place containing holy things, or *secretarium*, meaning a separated place meant to protect.

In symbolic terms, we can consider the sacristy like the womb of the Blessed Virgin where Christ put on fleshly vesture in the incarnation in order to carry out the sacred action of His paschal mystery. As the priest vests, he aims to take upon himself interiorly the spiritual meaning that the sacred vestments show exteriorly. Each vestment alludes to a concept conveyed in Scripture. Seen most often on the altar servers, the surplice is a short white garment symbolizing being clothed in the "new man." (2 Cor 4). The amice covers the priest's collar with linen and evokes the helmet of salvation (Eph 6). The alb has been in liturgical use since the 4th century and as it is donned, the priest invokes the blood of the Lamb to cleanse and purify his heart. The cincture binds the alb around the priest's waist and with it, he prays that the fire of concupiscence may be quenched. The maniple is worn on the left forearm and is a sign of labor. By it, the priest asks that his labors may be blessed with rejoicing and reward.

The stole hangs around the priest's and deacon's neck. It is the oldest vestment that is particularly liturgical in its use. It symbolizes the office of the wearer and, placing it on, the cleric prays for immortality. The priest clothes himself in the chasuble praying, "O Lord, Who said, 'My yolk is easy and My burden light': (Mt 11) grant that I may bear it well and follow after Thee with thanksgiving. Amen." As you've noticed, the chasuble can be made of many different styles, but they are group into two: the "fiddle back" or Latin style, and the Gothic style (the latter is more ample over the arms). Along with the stole and maniple, it is made of the liturgical color of the day and ideally from silk. The deacon and subdeacon also wear outer vestments, but these are patterned differently from the chasuble; they include sleeves. The dalmatic and tunicle descend to us from the imperial and aristocratic courts of Roman times. Another vestment worn by the priest at liturgies outside of the Mass (including the *asperges* ceremony) is the cope. It is a large garment that hangs from the shoulder to the ankles. It is usually decorated with a "hood." This is a decorated piece of fabric that once served as a head covering, but now is mere vestige. Its ample construction forms a parallel with the veil that covers the oblation (the chalice veil). These call to mind for us the reality of sacrifice about to be undertaken through the coming liturgical action. There is no particular prayer for the cope, but silence itself can set the stage for heavenly contemplation—a prayer beyond words. Finally, the clerics are seen wearing birettas, black head covering that comes from the time of Roman magistrates. The three horns on it reminds us that the charism of a cleric to preach and to sacrifice comes from the Trinity.

All of these vestments serve the bestir for the eye and the soul that what is taking place in the liturgy is not like any other function of this world. Their use is not mere decoration, but a sacramental sign that we are soon to be drawn into heaven to be witnesses of the perfect sacrifice of Christ, offering Himself to the Father.

Once vested, the ministers and servers process from the sacristy into the sanctuary. This calls to mind for us the departure of Christ from heaven to enter this world to carry out His work for our salvation. This work is shown in the three minister: the subdeacon stands for Christ prophesied in the Old Testament, the Deacon stands for Him revealed in the New Testament, the Priest stand for Him Who is even now among us as sacrificer and sacrifice. ~Fr.
