SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Holy water is a stable fixture in many rites of liturgical life. It reminds us of all the graces of our baptism. Holy water shows prominently in the rites of the Easter Vigil and in order to remind the people about the importance of the queen of all feasts, the Church sprinkles Holy Water upon the people every Easter Sunday in the *novus ordo*, and every Sunday in the *usus antiquior*.

The asperges recalls the Easter mystery for us—that we are cleansed by the merits of Christ's Paschal mystery. The rite of the asperges is preceded by the priest's act of exorcising and blessing the salt and the water. Salt evokes the Old Testament miracle by which Elijah made the sullied waters wholesome (4 Kgs 2:20). We can see the salt as a foreshadowing of Christ's power to turn water into a source of spiritual cleansing and fruitfulness. Blessed with this exorcised salt, the people of God are well-equipped to carry out their task as the salt of the earth (Mt 5) and never lose their savor.

The sprinkling rite itself is a pre-Mass ritual which both prays for blessings and protection. A similar ritual is carried out even daily in monasteries when the monks or their cells are cleansed nightly after compline. Seeing our weekly asperges can help us to feel united to the countless souls devoted to a hidden life of prayer.

The asperges concludes with a prayer that God would send His angel to guard, cherish, protect, visit and defend us. This is the same prayer that is said when a priest visits to bless the homes of the faithful. Using the same prayer of blessing and protection again helps to draw close the whole world of faith: there is connection between what happens in public churches and in far-away monasteries; there is a connection between what happens at churches and what takes places within the private homes of the faithful.

Invoking the "angel of God" makes obvious reference to those celestial persons that God sends as His messengers. But the "Angel of God" also refers to Christ Himself. After all, this prayer of blessing and protection is an outcry for the grace obtained for us by Christ. Moreover, our plea for mercy as we chant the first line of the *Miserere* psalm is another request for which we hope only due to the Blood of our Savior. Cleansing, blessing, protection and forgiveness are the fruits of the Sacrament of Baptism, and these are the same spiritual fruits that the *asperges* seeks to obtain.

After the *asperges*, the priest puts aside the cope and changes to the chasuble. This signifies the start of the prayers of the Mass where Christ is present among us. In the *asperges*, the priest prays for Christ's blessing in his own name on behalf of his congregation. In the Mass, he wears the chasuble to signify that the priest is standing in Christ's place, ready to carry out Christ's work for the people.

The Mass begins with the sign of the cross as the choir chants the *introit*. The cross is an external manifestation of mission that the priest is about to undertake and the mystery about to unfold. The prayers at the foot of the altar contain Psalm 42 as an act of preparation—to makes one's cause known to God. In the time of St. Ambrose, Psalm 42 was sung as the neophytes processed for the first time from the baptistry to the altar. When we use it at each Mass, Baptism is invoked yet again as we undertake our prayer.

The ministers are directed to hold their hands "folded" which is a posture having roots in medieval times as a sign of submission from an inferior to a superior. Joined or folded hands has itself become a posture of prayer as we seek God's dominion over us. The priest and ministers recite the *confiteor* each in turn. They strike their breast invoking the act of humility extolled by our Lord in Luke 18. These many penitential gestures are carried out for two reasons. First, so that the ministers may be spiritually disposed and free from guilt. Also, however, because the priest stands in the place of Christ, these gestures show us Christ's willingness to debase Himself for our sake. Christ "bore our sins in His body" (1 Pet 2:24) and took the form of a servant (Phil 2:7). ~Fr. O'Brien
