

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

The moment that the priest and ministers ascend the altar seems, at first, to be a merely practical one. However, in the liturgy, even the simple moments can be endowed with great meaning. Abbé Barthe in his <u>A Forest of Symbols</u> explains that after the priest and minsters pray a dialogue, the priest silently recites the *aufer a nobis*, again beseeching God's mercy as he ascends the holy place. This prayer can be traced to the sixth century and is followed by a prayer invoking the saints whose relics are in the altar stone.

Next, the priest kisses the altar. It stands as a sign of respect, friendship, intimacy and a gesture of peace. The kiss signifies a marriage made present in the Holy Mass, the unique union of Heaven and Earth—the divine and the human join together. Just as Christ united our human nature to His divine nature, the Mass brings the people of God into God's own presence using material instruments as channels of grace. The simple gesture of a kiss points also to the fact that Christ has come among us as a divine bridegroom, preparing the Church for Himself as a spotless bride (Is 61:10, Eph 5:27, Rev 19:8).

Follow this, the priest incenses the altar on top and across the front with an elaborate routine. Incensation has been an established element of Christian worship since the second century. It also has roots in Jewish worship (Ps 140:2) and is referred to in the New Testament (Rev. 5:8, 8:3). Incense is a gift offered to God by means of burning; therefore, it takes on the character of sacrifice since the item is destroyed in the act of offering. It is often sweet smelling which is conveys a purifying symbolism: driving away unpleasant things both temporal and spiritual. The sacrifice of burning incense gives a visual embodiment to the offering of our prayers to God. Both, we hope, will ascend to God's holy place in heaven. Christ's role as sacrificer was foretold by the gift of frankincense at the visit of the Magi. Incense, therefore, reminds us that the whole of the life of Christ was an offering to the Father. Similarly, then, we recall that Christ is with us as we daily offer ourselves in union with Him.

The priest incenses the altar in a way that is meant to completely surround the altar with this blessed burnt offering. Associating this smoke with the altar signifies the altar as the place of sacrifice. He begins by incensing the cross of the altar (it shows us the apex of Christ's self-sacrifice), then the right side of the altar, then returning to the center, he then incenses the altar's left. This ritual has origins in the processional rite proper to the ancient liturgical rituals. Thereby, recalling for us that the Holy Mass places us on a continuous pilgrimage with Christ toward the Father-a journey that is only made possible by sacrifice. Once the altar is incensed, you will notice that the priest hands the thurible to the deacon who promptly incenses him. This illuminates the priest's role as both sacrificer and sacrifice. The priest's work at the altar is not just to reenact the externals of Christ's passion, but to lovingly offer himself in union with the Lord. The priest stands in Christ's place Who is the one perfect Sacrifice, and the great High Priest, alone worthy to render an acceptable offering to the Father. ~Fr. O'Brien
