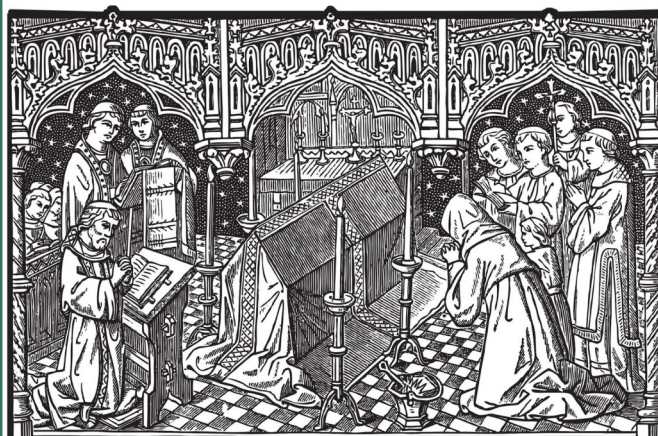

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

A Forest of Symbols expounds upon the *Gloria* first by recalling its origins at the moment of the our Savior's birth. To welcome the Christ Child among men, the angels cried out glorifying God. In times past, this beginning line "*Gloria in excelsis Deo*" (Lk 2:14) was embellished into the full text that we chant to this day. It was formerly known as the Great Doxology or the Angelic Hymn. The prayer of the *Gloria* as well as the *Sanctus* both echo the choirs of angels. Both of these hymns stirs in our minds recollections that our prayer is sacramentally joined to the prayer of the angels. Indeed, the liturgy of the Mass allows us be present at Christ's earthly arrival, and so we pray *Gloria*; then, we witness His death and glorification, thus we echo the angels' *Sanctus*!

The text of the *Gloria* as we chant it today is largely attributable to St. Hillary of Poitiers (d. 367). Some speculate that he obtained inspiration from his time traveling in the Christian east. He composed part of the hymn intending to combat the heresy of Arianism. For this reason we extoll Christ's glory and divinity "*Tu solus sanctus! Tu solus Dominus! Tu solus altissimus!*"

The *Gloria* is among the most ancient of liturgical hymns and displays common structural elements such as the style of a litany where the attributes of God's glory are listed one after another. Also, the fact that the *Gloria*, like the *Te Deum*, has a doxological arrangement honoring the Father first, then the Son. The *Gloria* also resembles a form of invocation and response as the stanzas complement each other antiphonally. This is also a trait present in early liturgical chants, such as the *Christus vincit*.

Through the history of the liturgy, it is common to notice that hymns migrate from the Divine Office into the Mass. The *Gloria* is no exception. While the text is Gallican in origin, by the time it made its way to Rome, the text was subsumed into the Mass itself.

Originally the *Gloria* was reserved for papal Masses, and the pope himself would lead the singing. Gradually, the practice spread by the seventh to ninth centuries to Masses celebrated by ordinary priests. But to recall the special connection of this chant to the office of the bishop, the priest must still be the one to intone the first few notes of the chant.

While we chant the *Gloria*, we witness our clergy proclaim Good News. Particularly on Sunday mornings, we can marvel anew at that original Christmas morning and stir in our souls sentiments of welcoming the new-born Christ while we praise Him with the angels for the new dawn He brings to this fallen creation! ~Fr.
