

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Gregorian Chant and the Liturgy of the Mass in the Roman Rite have been inseparable companions from the earliest times of the Church. In my column today, I would like to summarize for you some of Abbé Barthe's reflections on the introit (EEN-trow-eet) chant of the Mass. We can view the various proper chants of the Mass in two categories: those that are meant for times of meditation (gradual, alleluia, sequence), and those that accompany a procession (introit, offertory, communion). The introit adorns the moment of the Mass when the priest enters and prepare himself for Mass; concluding this segment of the Mass is the celebrant's prayer known as the "collect." Then, as we bring to God the bread and wine (along with the oblations of our body and soul), we hear the offertory antiphon sung; concluding this segment of the Mass is the celebrant's prayer, the "secret." Thirdly, as the community processes forward to meet the Lord at the Communion rail, the Communion antiphon is chanted; this too is complemented with a celebrant's prayer called the "post-Communion."

These chants bring our minds to the ritual of the breviary which can be witnessed in monasteries. Each time a psalm is sung in the breviary, it is preceded and concluded with an antiphon. What we see is this: the *schola cantorum* chants the antiphon which is set to a complex (melismatic) melody, then after the antiphon, a psalm verse and the *Gloria Patri* are chanted to a simpler tone in just the same way that the breviary is chanted: repeating a note through many syllables with a fixed pattern of notes at the middle and end of each stanza of the psalm (the cadences). After the *Gloria Patri* is chanted according to the psalm tone, the same antiphon is repeated. Retaining this structure in both the breviary and the Mass helps us to realize the unity of the Church's liturgy, and allows us to sense a unity with those many thousands of souls dedicated to sanctifying the whole day with the prayer of the Church, the breviary.

More than mere background decoration for the priest's entrance, the introit is an integral part of the Mass. In fact, the first words of the introit usually serve as title for that day's liturgy; we all know *Laetare* Sunday in Lent. The introit is recited by the priest after he makes the sign of the cross. This moment of the Mass represents for us the entrance of Christ into the world, and His 30 years of silent preparation in the home of Mary and Joseph prior to His ministry and saving Passion. Any number of "processions" of Christ can be fruitfully recalled at this moment in our prayer: His journey from Bethlehem to the Temple in Jerusalem, from Bethany to Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, from Jerusalem to Golgotha, from the realm of the dead to the glory of the Resurrection, or the journey of all the faithful into the new heaven and the new earth on the last day.

Since the introit chant typically contains an Old Testament psalm, this too reminds us that the arrival of Christ was foretold by the ancient prophesies and awaited by the many generations of Jews: those who chanted the psalms under the old dispensation, and those in the time of Christ who took to their lips the new song of praise, the *Gloria Patri*, once they acknowledged the Most Holy Trinity. Now, benefitting from these previous epochs of faith, you and I listen to this introit chant standing in a privileged place: the fullness of God's truth revealed in Christ and communicated by the Church.

As the celebrant recites the introit, he stands at the left of our Lord upon the cross (the right side of the altar as seen by the people). This side is typically called the epistle side of the altar to give the place of higher dignity to the Gospel which is read at our Lord's right side (i.e., the left as seen by the people). You will notice that the celebrant and the other sacred ministers incline toward the cross and bow as they pray the *Gloria Patri*. This is one of many moments that shows the orientation of our prayer. Just as our words have meaning and relevance for our prayer, so too does each gesture and even the direction we face when we pray. \sim Fr. O'Brien
