SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Dom Barthe in *A Forest of Symbols* sheds additional light on the place of the epistle reading in the holy Mass by linking it to the ancient Jewish liturgy of the synagogue. The Jewish synagogue has given way to the new rites of the New Covenant in Christ. To symbolize this movement, the epistle precedes the proclamation of the Gospel. The epistle tells us of Christ foretold, much like the rituals of the synagogue, the Gospel tells us of Christ proclaimed, as we experience in the reading of the Gospel. Other elements show the preparatory character of the epistle: it is chanted by the subdeacon (who stands as a symbol for Christ foretold by the prophets), it is chanted on the left of the cross (the side of lesser dignity, the right as the people look on).

In the early Church, there were some traditions whereby the Mass was accompanied by many readings before the Gospel. However, as early as the sixth century we see it become standard to have only one reading before the Gospel, except for special occasions. This aligns with the Eastern Catholic liturgical traditions as well. We can think of the epistle in the light of John the Baptist: it is the final pronouncement before Christ is made known in the Gospels.

In this light, the epistle (even if it be taken from the New Testament) is a summary of the whole of the Old Testament, and it is chanted facing East from whence Christ is expected to return (Mt. 24:27). For their part, the faithful sit restfully to listen to the epistle, to take in its teaching and meditate on the way Christ is found within it. Once the epistle is completed, the ministers reply *Deo gratias*. The subdeacon returns to the center of the altar to reverence the One Whom he proclaimed, then kneels before the celebrant, kisses his hand and obtains a blessing. This gesture can be seen as a parallel to the kiss of peace later in the Mass. The deacon receives the kiss of peace from the celebrant while standing. The deacon signifies the New Testament and therefore the relationship between the deacon and the celebrant is much more intimate, and mutual. However, the subdeacon who stands for the prophets of the Old Testament (while they contain Christ's power as the Word of God) kneels before the celebrant to demonstrate the greater clarity of Christ in the flesh.

Once the epistle is chanted, the people will notice the schola take up the gradual chant. It is sung in a responsorial mode, meaning that the entire schola alternates with a single cantor for a part. This mode is a pattern that one would also observe in certain parts of the chanted breviary as well. The full Gregorian chant tones of these graduals are among the most virtuosic and allegorical. They create the perfect setting to foster meditation on what was read in the epistle while disposing the heart properly for what is about to be chanted in the Gospel. The psalms make several appearances throughout the liturgy of the Mass, but this moment in particular we can reflect on the time spent by our Lord and the Apostles praying the psalms as they encountered and proclaimed the Word of God during their lives.
