SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Last time as I conveyed the reflections of Dom Barthe's $\underline{\Lambda}$ Forest of Symbols, we considered the artistic and theological qualities of the prayer called the "Collect." As mentioned, the Collect is the first of three prayers offered by the celebrant which are unique to that particular liturgical day. The others are called the Secret and the Post-Communion. Since these prayers should be seen as a group, Dom Barthe pauses to point out that all three of these prayers are preceded by a greeting from the celebrant to those in attendance. In the case of the Collect and Post Communion, the greeting comes immediately before, whereas the greeting before the Secret is separated by the complex sequence of offertory prayers. In addition, there are two more greetings which demarcate the order of the Mass. One occurs at the prefect to the Canon, and the other is the sign of peace give among the clergy at a Solemn High Mass.

First, take note that the greetings are accompanied by the priest kissing the altar. He does so as a signal to us all that the greeting is not just that of a man, but the priest celebrating the Mass bring us the greeting of Christ. The altar is kissed because it stands as the primary symbol of Christ is our midst: the altar is engraved with five crosses reminiscent of His five wounds, at its consecration, the altar is anointed with Chrism (Christ means "the anointed one"); the altar contains the relics of the saints, giving representation of the Church who is the Body of Christ, finally, the altar is vested in altar cloths of linen and silk to show forth His priesthood.

After the kiss of the altar, the celebrant turns and chants one of three greetings. If he is a bishop, he initially chants "pax vobis;" at the sign of peace, the priest says, "pax tecum," a greeting which is then passed among the sacred ministers and the servers. Most often, the celebrant is heard chanting, "Dominus vobiscum." In any case, the response is the same, "Et cum spiritu tuo." The gesture made in each of these greetings is the opening out of the priest's hands which evokes the "holy kiss" of the early Christian community in Romans 16:16.

Similarly, the greeting "The Lord be with you," has biblical roots in the Old Testament, such as Ruth 2:4 or Judges 6:12. The bishop is privileged to use the resurrection greeting of Christ Himself (John 20:20). Likewise, the response, "And with thy Spirit," places the words of Scripture upon our lips. It is the greeting of St. Paul to Timothy (2 Tim 4:4). Note, as well, that the priest is directed to keep his eyes downcast as he offers Christ's greetings, a gesture of sobriety and modesty. All of these elements above demonstrate that our community is not founded upon ourselves, nor any one person's abilities, nor personality. But rather, we are formed into a supernatural friendship by God's grace. The community we are aiming to foster is that same fellowship enjoyed by the Apostles as they met the risen Christ, the same as the affection between Paul and the early churches, the same as the fellowship that has sustained the Body of Christ throughout the ages!

After the greeting, we are exhorted by the celebrant into prayer as he chants, "oremus" toward the east, that is the *locum divinitatis*, and toward the place where we will meet the Lord when He comes upon the clouds at the last day. Upon concluding his prayer, the people yet again take Scripture upon their lips, chanting "Amen" (Rev. 20:22). Such a simple word contains an important meaning. From Hebrew, Amen means "May it be done to us as you have asked." Our Lord says "Amen" frequently as well, in which case it takes on the meaning, "It is true!" ~Fr. O'Brien
