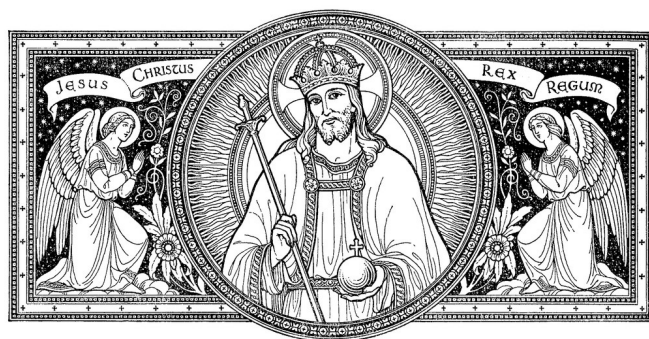

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Following Dom Barthe's reflections on the Holy Mass, allow me to offer two last insights regarding the "Collect" which the priest prays just before the epistle. First, his posture should be noted. The priest holds his hands with fingers outstretched, about the width of his shoulders. This is commonly called the *orans* posture; it is used for all three celebrant's prayers as well as during the Canon of the Mass. This posture evokes for us the image of Moses who held up his hands as an intercessory measure for the people during the battle with the Amalekites (Ex 17:11-12). In a posture of awe, Solomon was noted to hold his hands toward heaven when he prayed before the altar (3 Kgs 8:22). These two images foretold of Christ who spread out his hands upon the cross to make perfect intercession for us in His passion. Also, we can call to mind the ascension of our Lord with His hands raised up. For us at St. Patrick's, we are blessed to look upon Christ's transfiguration where he holds a similar posture. As the priest takes on this gesture, which was made perfect in Christ, we are shown once again that the priest himself is standing in Christ's place (praying even in the very posture of Christ), as head of the Body of Christ. The priest is another Christ before our eyes—in our age carrying out the one work of prayer which makes salvation possible. Thus, the priest acts on the words of the Psalmist, "Let my prayer be directed as incense in thy sight; the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice." (Ps 140:2)

As the Collect ends, the priest verbally invokes Christ's name to conclude the prayer. You have certainly noticed that this is done many times during the Mass and in various forms. The three celebrant's prayers have the long conclusion which invoke all three Persons of the Holy Trinity. Other prayers conclude briefly as we pray, "through Christ our Lord. Amen." All of these can be seen as simplifications of the complex conclusion of the Canon. At that moment, the priest holds the host over the chalice and, concluding the most solemn prayer in the Mass, he says, "*Per ipsum, et cum ipso, et in ipso est tibi Deo Patri, omnipotenti, in unitate Spiritus Sancti, omnis honor et gloria.*" (By Him, with Him, and in Him, is to Thee, God the Father Almighty, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honor and glory.) As Dom Barthe reflects, "[...] we must make our requests to the Father in the name of Christ, the one intercessor authorized by God, in order to be certain that our prayer will be acceptable to him (Jn 15:16)."

In the next segment of the Mass, we turn our attention to proclamation of the Word of God. As in other parts of the Mass, notice the hierarchical nature of the readings. The hierarchy is seen most clearly in a bishop's solemn Mass: if there are readings that precede the epistle (as on Ember days) they are chanted by a lector, the epistle is chanted by the subdeacon, and the Gospel is chanted by the deacon. Ultimately, then, the bishop, who is the teacher of the people, *par excellence*, instructs the people with the authority of the Apostles. Even in the less complex Solemn High Mass, these dynamics are still shown in that the priest, who is designated as the bishop's collaborator, preaches most often to the people. This progressive hierarchy of ministers proclaiming the Word is a parallel for the progress of God's people from the Old Covenant to the New Covenant. The aim of lectionary cycle is to assist the faithful to move from darkness to light, from Old Testament to New, from shadow to reality, from Christ foretold to Christ proclaimed. For this reason, the epistle of the Mass is usually a New Testament text, but the Old Testament is seen very often in Mass chants, and in the pre-epistle readings, but also the epistle itself at times. ~Fr.
