Excerpts from *Images of Hope: Meditations on Major Feasts*

Images of Hope: Meditations on Major Feasts is a beautiful little book by then Cardinal Ratzinger, who later became Pope Benedict XVI. The Cardinal combines Scripture, history, literature, and theology in unique reflections on the Church's major feasts. Here is an excerpt from the book on All Saints Day and the *Campo Santo Teutonico* or German cemetery located at the feet of Saint Peter's Basilica

"The German cemetery of Rome, once belonged to Nero's circus, the place where the first martyrs of Rome died for Christ. The place where Nero played his macabre game of death has become a holy place for Christians. The tyrant took his own life, but even the presumably indestructible Roman Empire fell. The faith of martyrs, the faith of Peter, survived the tyrants and the Roman Empire.

"Around the year 800, the Franks founded a cemetery here in which they buried their pilgrims to Rome. The cemetery of the Germans evolved from this. It is not difficult to guess what the Franks were thinking. The tomb of Peter was no ordinary tomb. It bore witness to the stronger power of Jesus Christ, which extends beyond death.

"Thus the cemetery, the site of mourning and transience, has become a place of hope. That is Christian. Whoever has himself buried here says: I believe in you Christ, who rose from the dead, I hold fast to you. I do not come alone. I come in the communion of saints, who even in death do not leave me.

"So the message of the cemetery is manifold. It reminds us of death and of eternal life. It invites us to live in such a way that we do not leave the communion of saints. It invites us to seek and to be in life what can live on in death and in eternity."
