## SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Please consider contributing the names of your deceased loved ones to our Parish Book of the Dead. Each November, we spend extra effort in prayer so as to intercede for those who have preceded us “in the sleep of peace.” **Envelopes can be found on the back tables of church; kindly use them to submit names** which will be recorded for public prayer in November.

November begins with the **Solemnity of All Saints**. It is a Holy Day of Obligation, and St. Patrick’s will have Masses at 11:30 a.m., 12:15 p.m. and a Solemn Latin Mass at 5:30 p.m. For those who attend the evening Mass, our prayer will be beautified by Gregorian Chant and organ. The **Commemoration of All Souls** on November 2nd will be celebrated with an evening Mass at 6:30 p.m. and the sacred music of Claudio Casciolini, *Missa pro Defunctis*, and Palestrina.

Last month, Archbishop Aymond provided the clergy and laity of the Archdiocese an update about the Chapter 11 bankruptcy reorganization proceedings. The Archdiocese initiated the proceedings about 3 years ago and the process has taken much longer than originally thought. The attached QR code can be used to read the Archbishop’s most recent update. In sum, it details the challenges of the proceeding to this point which have resulted in the parishes and apostolates of the Archdiocese needing to make a financial contribution to final settlement between the Archdiocese and the abuse victims. Unfortunately, at this point, very few details are known about how much money will be needed; neither do we have a timeframe for when clarity will be available. This update was a surprise to us due to the fact that we had been told that the bankruptcy would only affect the finances of the Archdiocese and not the parishes. However, due to the number of cases and a change in Louisiana law, the liabilities are greater than anticipated. Parish contributions to the bankruptcy settlement will have a legal benefit, namely immunity from suits which could claim that parishes are directly liable for the misdeeds of former clergy. The legal device that would have this result is called a “channeling injunction.”



We know that this news will affect the way some people see the Church and participate in her life. For this reason, our Lord issued some of His most vehement admonitions about the spiritual toll of scandal; that is when the sin of one leads another away from God. It is my prayer that the sins of former clergy will not have the final word, but rather that we can continue to fight darkness with supernatural light. I have felt the burdens, the shaken trust, and the frustration of the legal/financial side of this current turmoil. It is no surprise that parishioners feel less inclined to invest their tithes with St. Patrick’s and St. John’s given the new uncertainty of our bankruptcy involvement. Please be assured that I regard your contributions as a sacred trust for our parish’s mission and daily operation. Humbly, I thank you and request your continued support.

I have had the opportunity to discuss this development with our parish Pastoral Council and Finance Council. Their insights have been a reminder that some of you know priests who have been a source of scandal. Thus, the news may open old wounds and harm trust. I pray that healing can come through transparency and honest discussion about what you have suffered. Another Finance Council member offered the reminder that the sin of one member of the body has ripple effects for the whole body. As such, a spiritual perspective can shed light even on the financial side of our current turmoil. We all suffer due to the sin of one, but by God’s grace, we can all obtain healing and redemption by our sacrifices and prayers. Be assured that I will continue to convey information as I receive it, and, as always, please send me your questions directly if I can be of any assistance during this time. ~Fr. O’Brien
