LENTEN FASTING AND ABSTINENCE


Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics.

In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Dom Pius Parsch was one of highest-regarded liturgical theologians and commentators of the early 20th century. Below is a brief excerpt about the liturgy's content for the Second Sunday of Lent. He first notes that the chants of the Mass contain somber themes, even the chants themselves seem to be particularly grave in their sound. While this places the listener in the heaviness of Christ's passion (which is an important part of our Lenten journey), Lent is leading us through the Passion into the glory of grace.

He writes, "Yet the somber note—fasting and penance, and the suffering of Christ—is not the whole purpose of Lent. It is only the beginning, the transition. The goal is one of light and joy. In all our preoccupation with original sin we must never lose sight of grace. The liturgy can find no finer illustration of the glory of grace than the image of the transfigured Christ. There is much to be learned from this Gospel, or rather from this vision of Christ which today's Gospel gives us.

"First of all, then, we are shown the Lord. He whom last Sunday we saw in bitter conflict with Satan today appears transfigured in the glory of His godhead. His temptation was a veiled picture of His humiliation on the Cross; His transfiguration is the symbol of His resurrection, His Easter glory, His heavenly kingship.

"Yet it is not He alone who goes on from warfare to victory, from temptation to transfiguration. He leads His Church, His Mystical Body, along this selfsame road. Just as in His conquest of Satan He won the victory for us all—for all who are His—so today, in His transfiguration, we see that He is by no means alone. He is surrounded by the Church of the Old and New Testaments. Moses and Elias represent the Old Law; Peter, James, and John, the New. Both dispensations are caught up in the transfiguration. The Church enters into Christ's transfiguration. That is the lesson of today's Gospel."
