SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

The offertory of the Mass follows the *Credo*. Dom Barthe observes that there was, in late antiquity, a part of Mass which made reference to the various food offerings of the faithful. At that time, the priest prayed for a blessing of bread that was not intended to be consecrated in the Mass, but was for the bodily sustenance of the people who presented it. The prayer made reference to the “Bread of Angels” which was a term used to acknowledge the miraculous providence of God through the Manna and the multiplication of loaves. The origin of this mid-Mass blessing either came from the fact that the people would receive Holy Communion very infrequently and so a blessing of bread was a kind of substitute. Alternatively, it derived from a time when the bread for Holy Communion was presented and brought forward by the family who supplied it for that particular Mass.

This bread blessing does not remain in the Mass. In our day, we witness the priest extend a greeting “*Dominus vobiscum*” and “*Oremus*” to the people at the end of the *Credo*. These two typically precede a prayer, such as we see in the Collect and the Post-communion. But, in this case an antiphon follows the “*Oremus*.” Several possibilities have been put forward as to why. First, we can suppose that the greeting forms the start of the offertory which then concludes with the priest’s prayer called the Secret. Another possibility was that there was, in ancient times, a litany that followed the “*Oremus*.” In two ancient missals, (the Gelasian and the Milanese) there was also a prayer at this moment to solemnize the unveiling of the offering.

The prayers of the offertory that follow have a very sacrificial tone. One might even think they are referring to the Eucharistic offering, but, the Eucharist has not yet been consecrated. Barthe reflects that the notion of sacrifice appears very strongly at this point in the liturgies of East and West. The reason is Christological and refers to Psalm 40 and Hebrews 10. “Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me.” While we make our humble sacrifice of bread and wine, it is, however, the Body of the Lord which is the cause of our hope! Consider this as a kind of pre-consecration. Dom Barthe writes, “At once, the liturgical sequence is upset: the Offertory anticipates the act that is going to reproduce the sacrifice of the Cross, just as Christ anticipated the offering of the Passion.” This offering of bread before consecration evokes other times Christ was offered to the Father before His Passion: such as the presentation in the temple, and in the garden of Gethsemane. ~Fr.
