## SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

---

We have been blessed with a very joyful celebration of the Paschal Triduum—all glory be to God! I am very thankful for all those who contributed toward making the church shine with beauty and the liturgies to be so splendid in every way. Many graces for souls have been imparted because of your generosity!

Now that we have arrived in the Easter Season, I would like to resume my review of *A Forest of Symbols* by Abbé Claude Barthe. One element that struck me this past Holy Week was the frequency of professing the faith. We welcomed three adults into the Catholic faith and baptized another three. During the rituals that preceded their sacraments of initiation, the rite called for them to individually profess “I believe” to the three major parts of the creed at the beginning of the ritual, as well as just before the sacrament of baptism. Then, the whole congregation takes part in this profession by renewing their baptismal vows as part of our Easter liturgies. Such emphasis gives us pause to reflect on the meaning of why the profession of faith is a routine part of our liturgical worship.

Dom Barthe recalls that, historically speaking, the *Credo* was written in the context of clarifying the Christological controversies of the early Church. Professing the creed in ritual form originates from the liturgical traditions of the ancient Christian East. The Spanish received the tradition into their liturgies in the sixth century, placing it just before Communion, similar to the order seen in the baptismal liturgy. Rome was slower to adopt the practice on the grounds that the Roman Church had never suffered doctrinal confusion. Also, the doctrinal purity of the Roman Canon was considered something of a profession of faith in its own right. Later in the 11th century, when the Gallican liturgies were influencing the Roman liturgy, the *Credo* became part of the Roman Rite. Unlike other parts of the Mass texts, such as the *Kyrie* and *Gloria*, the *Credo* was always sung by all the singers in unison and without any embellishments. This showed the unity of all believers and the completeness of the creed in its original composition.

The spiritual significance of reciting the creed first brings to mind that many of us have received our faith from our parents, and our countless spiritual brothers and sisters that have gone before us. Receiving the faith as a child, we then reiterate it with our own lips. This shows our personal acceptance, as well as our willingness to transmit our faith to all those around us. Professing the creed just before baptism, we perceive the creed as something of a spiritual threshold, a sacred portal through which one is admitted to the life of grace. This notion still holds true for those already baptized. After the Gospel and the homily during the Mass, we stand on the threshold of the offertory and the Canon of the Mass. If we do not believe, we ought not proceed any closer! However, professing our faith by the creed grants us access to more mysteries, particularly the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ.

The creed is something we must approach humbly! Keep in mind, that professing our faith is only possible because we have received it. First from God, and then, from the faithful who have passed it on to us. To believe is a grace! Therefore, when we profess our faith, we are witnessing the effects of grace. I encourage you to recite the words or to join in the chant with attention and purpose. See this moment as an illumination whereby your intellect is drawn up to its highest purpose—to receive truths revealed by God!

Finally, note that the creed is reserved for Sundays. This highlights the paschal character of the creed, thereby associating it with those days which are closely associated with baptism. Other important feast days also incorporate a creed. Just prior to the reforms of 1962, the creed was also recited on days of the doctors of the Church and the feast of Mary Magdalene who had the privilege of announcing the Easter faith to the apostles. ~Fr.
