

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Dom Barthe goes into depth reflecting on the allegorical relationship between our Lord's presentation in the Temple and the offertory of the Mass. The Presentation was a Jewish liturgical act. Firstborn males were required to be presented to God forty days after birth. At that time, parents presented an offering to God which symbolically re-purchased the child back from God. The parents' offering of an animal sacrifice would be a substitution for their first born who, by divine right, belonged to God. The rite reflected the tenth plague of Egypt when the Jewish firstborn were spared from the destroying angel; it also recalls the near-sacrifice of Isaac by Abraham. In the example of Isaac and the firstborn of the Jews at the time of the tenth plague, the first-borns have been spared. However, the very Son of God was not spared, but out of perfect love, He was sent as a sacrifice so that all might be spared eternal death.

This self-offering of the Son is the whole purpose of the incarnation! It occurred first when he offered Himself to the Blessed Mother by taking up flesh in the temple of her immaculate womb. Then, in the sacrifice offered to God at the moment of the presentation His mission of self-oblation was made manifest again. Finally, it is made explicit in His self-oblation in the garden of Gethsemane. Even the very events of our Lord's passion can be seen in the signs carried out during His presentation in the Temple. Two doves were offered by Joseph and Mary. These show forth His death and resurrection. The first dove required by the Jewish presentation liturgy was an offering for sin, in Christ's case this showed that He would die for our sins. The second dove was designated to be burnt at the altar of the Temple; this dove shows the resurrection of Christ in that the fire of Christ's divinity would triumph over death.

In the presentation, the sacrificial nature of Christ's mission was made known when Simeon foretold that our Lady would be pierced with a sword. This indicates the unique role that our Lady has regarding the offering of Jesus as a sacrifice, a role that has clear priestly overtones. She offered Him to the Father when He was in her womb. She brought Him to the Temple to be offered at the presentation. By Simeon's prophecy she shared in the suffering which came along with the offering of His life upon Calvary. Now, in her assumption, she eternally stands before the Father to offer her divine Son on behalf of us, her spiritual children. In this way, Mary stands as a model and an intercessor for the ordained priests who stand before the altar at Mass and offer the divine Son of God to the Father for the salvation of the world.

Jesus' offering is consummated on Calvary, but is it shown in sign at the Presentation in the Temple forty days after His birth. Similarly, the offering is consummated at the Mass during the Roman Canon, but it is shown in sign through the prayers of the offertory which follow the *Credo*. For this reason, the Church has long cherished the rich sacrificial language of the traditional offertory prayers.

The offertory sets the foundation for the sacrifice of Christ which is about to unfold during the Roman Canon, or Eucharistic Prayer. Our participation in this mystery is both to recognize it in the sign of Christ's sacrifice at Mass, but also to unite our sacrifices to His. Therefore, it belongs to us to reflect on the mysteries of Christ's life which was, from beginning to end, an offering. Then to intentionally notice the sacrifices God asks from us and to unite them to the one all-sufficient sacrifice of our Savior. ~Fr. O'Brien
