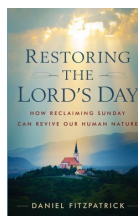

RESTORATION UPDATE

This past week saw the start of our renovation efforts!

- The organ is now covered and protected from construction dust.
- We have completed the contracts and other administrative tasks for the needed scaffolding, the painters and the roofers.
- The painters have begun preliminary floor level tasks.
- With the help of several parishioners, we have filmed a promotional video to solicit donations for the restoration.
- Projected start date for scaffolding: May 20th
- Projected start date for the new roof: June 17th.
- “Optimistic” completion date: August 20th



SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

A Forest of Symbols has shown us, in depth, the significance of the sacrificial nature of the Offertory of the Mass. These prayers occur while the schola chants the Offertory antiphon. This antiphon is one of three chanted antiphons of the Mass propers. The others are the Introit and the Communion antiphons. These three antiphons denote times where a movement or procession is occurring. The entrance of the gifts has been vastly simplified over the centuries, but the traditions of the past and the rituals found in the Eastern liturgies still evoke the celebratory character of when the offerings arrive at the altar. See Proverbs 22:8 and 2 Cor 9:7 (“God loves a cheerful giver”) as a reminder that the act of rendering to God has been a joyful, even exuberant duty since Old Testament times. The chant of the Offertory stirs us to this solemn joy as the people render their sacrifice to God. After all, we offer not only bread and wine, but the contributions of our works of religion, the duties of our vocation, and the sacrifices of our sufferings. How great a grace that these ordinary things may be presented to God for Him to accomplish His heavenly purposes!

In the Roman Rite, veiling and unveiling is an important way of denoting that some things spiritual must be noticed. Recall the unveiling of the candles at Candlemas, or the ashes of Ash Wednesday. Here at the Offertory, the sacred vessels and the hosts are uncovered from the beneath the chalice veil or humeral veil. Over the chalice veil is another veil, the burse, which sets a sacred place for the linen corporal. The name corporal derives from the Latin *corpus*, signifying that what is placed upon it will be transformed by consecration into the Body of the Lord. The subdeacon famously stands wrapped in the humeral veil holding the patten. The humeral veil is a silk rectangle of the liturgical color of the day. It is ample enough to cover the arms of the subdeacon. Another covering protects the contents of the chalice before and after the consecration. The pall is a separate item in the Roman Rite. However in centuries past, the corporal was large enough to be folded over the chalice. The linen of the corporal and the pall recall for us the linen burial cloths that covered the body of the Lord as he lay in the tomb, prefigured as they were by the swaddling cloths of His manger in Bethlehem.
