RESTORATION UPDATE

This past week in our renovation efforts:

- When it rains it pours! Due to the lighting strike of June 1st, our pipe organ has been disabled. After diagnosis, the problem is electronic in nature and will take roughly 6 more weeks to remedy. In the mean time, an electronic organ will be used as a substitute.
- Other “fatalities” of the lightning strike include part of our fire alarm system, several ethernet network switches (disabling our livestream capability), part of our security camera system, the narthex monitor system, a television and phone in the rectory, and the equipment supplying our internet service. All these systems were affected despite three layers of lighting and surge protection! Our insurance program covers these losses.
- Entergy decided to carry out a project on the gas lines beneath our front sidewalk. This project may require several weeks to complete. It is unrelated to our projects in church. It will eventually involve replacing the gas lines on our church property.
- The painters have removed all damaged material from locations accessible from ladders. They now shift their focus to the narthex where the scaffolding is completely assembled.
- Scaffolding assembly now appears to require to longer of the estimated time period. Projected date of scaffolding completion: June 19th.
- Projected start date for the new roof: June 17th.
- I miscalculated my “optimistic” overall completion date since I forgot to factor in scaffold construction and removal. A more realistic overall completion date is September 20th.



SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Let us take up once again the meditations on the offertory of the Mass by Dom Barthe in A Forest of Symbols. One cannot help but notice that the prayers of the offertory are accompanied by several private prayers of the priest. As we noted before these prayers already take a sacrificial tone despite the fact that the offering, at this moment, is mere bread and wine. The antiquity of these prayers is well established in early medieval sacramentaries. They are noticed in germ in the *Missale Gothicum* (7th century) and took their full form roughly around the 9th century in the *Sacramentary of Amiens*.

Not only do these prayers represent our heritage from past generations, but their value is also shown in their theological and poetic qualities. The prayers of the offertory serve as doublets echoing the great intercessory act of the Roman Canon. For example, the *Suscipe, sancta Pater* corresponds to the *Te igitur*. Notice in both of these the themes of unworthiness, need for salvation, and aspiration for eternal life. What the priest expresses in his own name in the offertory (using the pronoun “I”), he then offers on behalf of the whole Body in the Canon (using the pronoun “we”).

Another doublet is seen in the *Deus qui humane*, plus the *Offerimus tibi* of the offertory. These correspond to the part of the Canon in which the wine is consecrated. In both, the theme is the supernatural meeting of humanity and divinity. The mixing of the water and wine during the offertory has been noted by the Council of Florence as a theological point of instruction. At that time, errors over Christ’s human nature were corrected by this symbolic mixture which denotes that Christ was both human and divine. The water also evokes recollections of the water from the side of Christ, and the water that quenches every thirst. (Jn 4:13-14) ~ Fr. O’Brien
