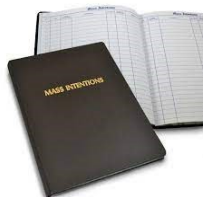

## RESTORATION UPDATE

This past week in our renovation efforts:

- Two large repairs remain to be completed from our lightning strike, the fire alarm and the organ. There is a possibility that the organ repair can be made in time for Sunday July 7th.
- The scaffolding assembly project required a few modifications so as to allow better access to the altars and upper ceiling. These introduced a price increase and a delay to the completion date. The scaffolders should be finished by July 5th.
- Our roofer has installed some temporary patches to protect the paint work while we wait for the roofing project to start. It should begin the first week of September and require 10 working days.
- The painters now have access to the platforms near the ceiling. You may notice the area near the large crucifix, as well as the lower church columns have fresh paint on them, resulting in a clean and bright look— a little glimpse of what is to come!
- Overall completion date goal: September 30th.



## SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Last week, I related the thoughts of Dom Barthe on the parallels between the offertory and the Roman Canon. That theme continues as he reflects on the *In spiritu humilitatis*, the *Lavabo* and the *Suscipe, sancta Trinitas*. The prayers, *In spiritu*, and *Veni Sanctificator* derive from the missals of Gaul and correspond to the prayer *Supplices te rogamus* of the Canon. In these prayers, notice how the content expresses our desire for the offering to be lifted up and accepted in God's presence as a source of blessings for us.

At the *Lavabo*, the priest places a psalm upon his lips to ask God for a clean heart as he makes the offering. This prepares the way for the *Nobis quoque peccatoribus*. Even in ancient times, the hands were seen as the "instrument of instruments" (Aristotle, *De Anima*). So, to cleanse them would be an expression of desire to sanctify all the works of man. This was seen in Jewish temple worship as well, where ritual cleansings were part of the act of sacrifice. It seems from its earliest introduction to the Christian liturgy, the washing of hands was always mystical in meaning, not merely practical. We first find it in early texts of Pontifical Masses from the 5th century. Near the end of the offertory (*Lavabo*) and near the end of the Roman Canon (*Nobis quoque peccatoribus*), the priest expresses his penitence so that the offering may be received favorably by God.

The *Suscipe, sancta Trinitas* is the last prayer of the offertory. Notice how this prayer mentions the Passion of the Savior, but also the memory of Mary, St. John the Baptist, St. Peter and St. Paul. This "roll call" reminds us of the list of early Christians named in the *Communicantes* and *Memento* of the Canon. Also, the remembrance or *anamnesis* of the *Suscipe, sancta Trinitas*, corresponds to the *anamnesis* of the *Unde et memores* of the Canon. In other words, both of these prayers explicitly recall the Passion of Christ so as to provoke God's attentiveness to the action we carry out at the altar. ~Fr. O'Brien
