RESTORATION UPDATE

This past week in our renovation efforts:

- The repainting has been completed in the narthex. Including additional gold leafing on the IHS monogram at the apex of the ceiling.
- Scaffolding assembly has been completed. Within the next week, we hope to have the scaffolding removed from the narthex.
- Our roofer has installed several large patches to protect the church interior while we prepare for our September start date for the roof replacement project.
- While it is not part of our parish project, Entergy has been replacing gas lines along the church sidewalk. Their task requires them to break concrete on parish property as well. While this might temporarily obstruct walk ways on our campus, we are in discussions with them to make the work as little obtrusive as possible. At the completion of the project, all walkways affected will be concreted at no cost to the parish.
- Overall completion date is September 30th.



SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

The act of incensation is a profoundly historical element of liturgical ritual, and the incensation of the offerings is the most complex. The incensation of the bread and wine occurs before the *lavabo*. The offertory incensation comes to the Roman Rite from Frankish origins, although we do see earlier connections with the incensations of the Great Entrance from Eastern liturgies. This incensation serves to connect this moment of offering bread and wine to a previous incensation, that of the reading of the Holy Gospel. In this way, the offertory incensation should not be seen as a stand-alone act, but one which points back to the offering of the Word of God at the Gospel chant, points to itself as a moment of offering bread and wine to God, and points forward to the elevation of the consecrated Host and Precious Blood.

Notice the method of incensation; it is all embracing: first, the oblations, then the altar cross, then the altar itself. Next, the ministers are incensed one by one, or in small groups. Finally the people themselves are incense to show that they too are enfolded in the offering we make together to God with Christ.

Not only is this incensation solemn and elaborate with ritual action, but also with verbal prayers too. While three scoops of incense are imposed upon the hot coals, the deacon asks for the blessing and celebrant replies, "*Per intercessionem beati Michaelis Archangeli...*" This prayer evokes the book of Revelation which tells us St. Michael's role in the Heavenly liturgy (Rev. 8:3). It implores God to accept our offering as a "sweet savor" which St. Thomas Aquinas says is a phrase also used to describe the movement of grace from God to the people. While continuing his verbal prayer, the celebrant censens the bread and wine thrice in the form of a cross and thrice in the form of a circle. These signs signify that the offering being censened is made in union with the death of Christ (shown in the form of cross), and in honor of the Trinity (shown in the three-ness of the gestures).

Mystically, we can liken this offering of incense to the three-fold anointing offered by Mary Magdalene in her hopes to honor and love Christ. See Lk 7:36, Mt 26:6, Mk 16:1. The fragrant aroma recalls her oil's perfume. The costliness of her gift evokes the worthiness of Christ of our devotion and love, and her anointing signifies preparation for a sacrifice to obtain mercy, which is the very nature of the Holy Mass. ~Fr.
