SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

In your kindness, please pray for me as I take my summer vacation from July 8th to the 20th. Thank you to Fr. William Farge and Fr. Walter Austin and others who will cover the Masses during my absence.

To continue with Dom Barthe's insights shown in A Forest of Symbols, let us consider the Orate fratres (Pray brethren, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Father Almighty). This prayer, too, has a parallel in the Roman Canon. Just as the Orate fratres exhorts the people to pray that the sacrifice would be seen as acceptable by God, so too does the Canon express this notion of acceptability in the Quam oblationem. This shows forth the theology of the liturgy, namely that the offering we make to God is not merely the material thing we place before Him, but the offering is made acceptable by spiritual means. The answer to this prayer is first, that we may offer our sacrifice with a heart of love, and second, that the offering itself would be radically changed into a more pleasing gift to the Father. This second part of the petition accomplished at the moment of consecration when the offerings are made into the real presence of Christ.

During the *Orate fratres*, we see the priest kiss the altar, face the people and continue turning in a full circle back to the altar. Only a few of his words are audible. This allegorically takes us back to the Garden of Gethsemane when the Lord was preparing Himself for the moment when He would sacrifice His life during His blessed Passion. In the garden, (Luke 22), there was silent prayer, verbal discussion, and an exhortation for the disciples to intercede for perseverance. "Pray, lest ye enter into temptation." In just the same way, the gestures and signs of the *Orate fratres* makes those same elements present for us.

Seeing the priest kiss the altar and turn in a circle might seem to be a strange gesture, but it is one that recalls the moment of the priest's blessing when a similar sequence of events occurs. This signifies that the *Orate fratres* is a kind of blessing for the people. There is an additional connection between this moment and the blessing at the end of Mass. In both places (the *Orate fratres*, and the *Placeat* before the blessing) yet again, we see prayers asking God to make our offering to Him acceptable. Such an oft-repeated request makes it clear to us that the sacrifice of the Mass is itself the work of God. He grants the offering; He makes the offering acceptable; He asks us to offer it to Him with love.

At this point of the offertory, the priest proceeds to pray the prayer called "Secret" (since is it said in silence), then incenses the oblations. Reflections on this ritual will follow soon! ~Fr. O
