

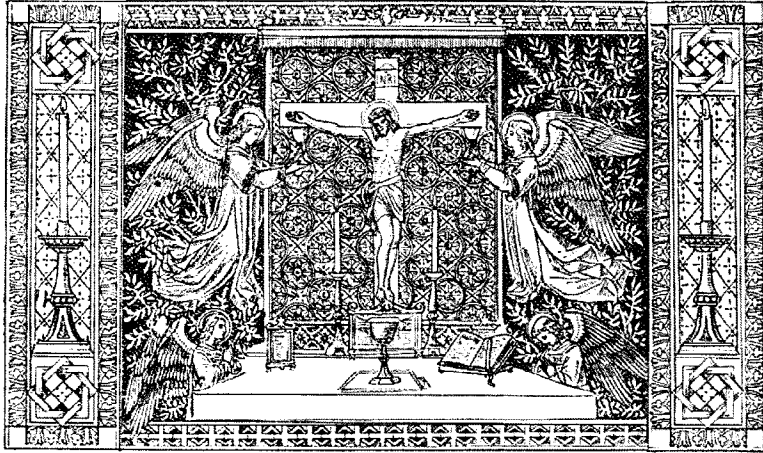

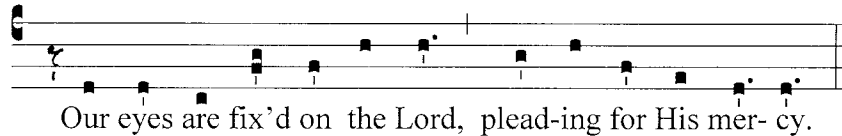

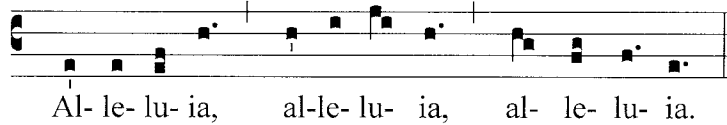
The Gloria is sung alternating between choir and congregation, the congregation beginning with the verse *Laudamus te*.
