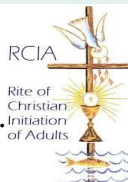

RESTORATION UPDATE

This past week in our renovation efforts:

- A tremendous “thank you” is due to the St. Joseph’s Guild, our parish men’s club, for their help cleaning the church after their monthly meetings!
- Painting work continues in the upper ceiling of the church nave.
- Concrete is being poured by Entergy to repair the front sidewalk.
- Overall completion date for the painting is September 30th. Scaffolding removal will proceed after that.



SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

I continue today with reflections from A Forest of Symbols about the incensation of the offerings during Mass. After the incense is blessed, the priest encircles the gifts with the censer three times, and crosses above them with it three times. He then proceeds to incense the altar cross three times. The number three is also employed with the Gospel book is incensed, as well as the priest himself, and the Blessed Sacrament. While proceeding to incense the altar cross and the altar, the priest prays the psalm *Dirigatur Domine*. This psalm refers to the lifting up of prayer like rising incense, and petitions the Lord for holiness of life for the priest making the offering.

Once the oblations, the cross, the relics and the altar are incensed, then a hierarchical order is observed in the incensation of the ministers and congregation. First, the celebrant is incensed, then the other clerics attending the Mass, then the two sacred ministers, then the servers are incensed in the order of their rank, and ultimately the people. This orderly succession imitates the orderly sequence whereby liturgical processions are organized. Moreover, it reflects the hierarchical manner in which God has organized his people ever since the time of Moses. Indeed, ever since the creation account, we can see that God has imprinted a divine ordering among the creatures he made. In a world so often tending to chaos, the methodical observance of order in the liturgy allows us to glimpse for a moment the restoration of the divine plan as well as anticipate the holy hierarchy we hope to experience in heaven.

The beauty of the ritual of incensation can stir in our hearts a spiritual fervor as well. We see in the burning of incense an image of Christ Himself. Christ offered His flesh on the altar of the cross while being filled with the fire of the Holy Spirit. It is our responsibility to follow Christ in all things! Therefore the sign of burning incense is also meant to bestir all the faithful toward an ardent self-oblation at this particular moment of the Mass. May it urge our hearts to better undertake a life of burning charity toward our fellow man, and incite us to the sweet odor of virtue.

That the congregation should be provoked into self-offering in this moment is an important reminder that we have been made into a priestly people (Rev. 1:6, 5:10, 20:6). Through the priest, it is Christ who takes the offering being made to the Altar of God in heaven, that offering being bread and wine (destined for transubstantiation) as well as the people themselves. Dom Barthe says, “It is therefore normal for the clergy and the people to be censured, to show that they all have their own share in the action of the priest.” The offerings, and the one performing the offering are shown as equated into one by this incensation of the oblata and all the people. Finally, note that this incensation of the Mass is decreed by the Council of Rouen (650AD), as carried out, “in memory of the death of our Redeemer.” ~Fr. O’Brien
