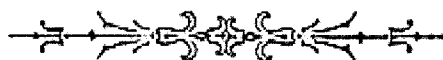

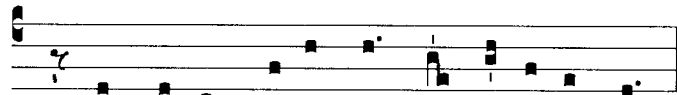

The Gloria is sung in alternation between the choir and the congregation, the congregation beginning with *Laudamus te*.

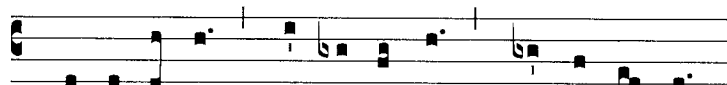

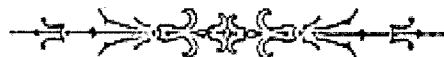
