RESTORATION UPDATE

This past week in our renovation efforts:

- At the time of this writing, I'm not certain how Hurricane Francine will affect our painting progress. But, our contractor has scheduled two Saturdays for his employees to make sure we stay on schedule! God's will be done!
- I have completed an inspection of the highest part of the ceiling with Keith Guy. This inspection precedes the removal of the upper three tiers of scaffold platform. I am very pleased with the workmanship and cannot wait for our parishioners to see the good fruits of our endurance!



SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Its my pleasure to resume the reflections of Dom Barthe in A Forest of Symbols. We've been examining the offertory prayers and ceremonies. Today, Dom Barthe reflects on the *Lavabo*. Upon washing his hands and praying the *Lavabo* psalm, his hands are now dedicated for their highest purpose, soon to unfold: the consecration of the Eucharist. After his fingers are cleansed, they are to be used for no other purpose than to touch the sacred Host. After the consecration, he will join his fingers to secure any particle of what may remain. In addition, this also further signifies the single-minded focus due to the *Sanctissimum*.

After the *Lavabo* psalm, the priest again addresses the Holy Trinity, kisses the altar and, turning, exhorts the people to pray, saying *Orate fratres*. The deacon or server replies asking God to accept the sacrifice, and then the priest offers the second of the three great priestly prayers of the Mass, the Secret.

In ancient missals, this prayer was called the *oratio super oblata*. By Roman custom, it was brought into the Roman Rite as a prayer said *secreta*, or in the low voice. To do so is a fitting prelude to the great silence during the Roman Canon which soon follows. At this point, we can recall the life of Christ. When His Passion approached, the Lord retreated from His disciples to pray alone and in quiet. Does not the *Orate fratres* make us recall the moment our Lord told His disciples to pray, lest they undergo the test (Mt. 26:41)?

Dom Barthe contrasts the silence of the offertory with that of the Canon. In the offertory, the priest is praying his personal prayers in order to prepare himself and the oblations for the great Sacrifice. However, the Secret and the Canon are silent because of the surpassing mystery which is contained: the whole Paschal Mystery! Prayer in quiet is a consistent theme through scripture. Not only do we see quiet prayer in the life of Christ, but also Hannah prays for Samuel by the prayer of her heart (1 Sam 1:13); Moses cried from the heart to God (Ex 14:15); the Psalmist also refers to the prayer of the interior life (Ps 4:5).

The content of the Secret is always oriented toward the unfolding of the act of sacrifice, and is not particularly tied to the liturgical year. At the prayer's conclusion, the priest breaks the silence with *Per omnia saecula saeculorum*. This demonstrates a thematic link between the Secret and the Preface to the Canon that immediately follows. Next time, I look forward to sharing even more insights as to why the Roman Canon is prayed silently. ~Fr. O'Brien
