*O how glorious is the kingdom in which all the saints rejoice with Christ! Clad in white robes, they follow the Lamb whithersoever he goeth.*

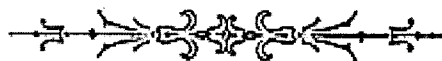
