SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

It has been a while since my last installment of reflections on A Forest of Symbols by Abbé Claude Barthe. I will resume at the moment the priest washes his hands at the conclusion of the offertory. As the priest washes his hands at the *Lavabo*, he prays Psalm 25, this is a gesture carried on from ancient worship in the Jewish temple and symbolizes the purification of the priest from sins. The priest leaves sin behind and his hands are now cleansed of all worldly things by this washing. Therefore, he is to refrain from picking up anything but the sacred Host and the chalice. In the more solemn forms of the Mass, the servers and sacred ministers facilitate this even by turning the pages of the missal for the priest. After the priest consecrates the Host, he again signals that his hands are set apart for divine things by adjoining his thumb and forefinger until after Holy Communion and the ablutions. This symbolic purpose also has a practical one. The priest knows that he has touched the Holy of Holies, the divine and glorified flesh of the Savior. Each fragment of the Host is just as sacred as any other. For that reason, whatever particle of the Host that the priest can see and feel, He is responsible for honoring. Thus, once he has touched the Host, he keeps his fingers adjoined to protect whatever may have adhered to his fingers, lest any fragment of the Host fall unknow to the floor! Holding the thumb and forefinger together may be an abnormal gesture, but it is an obvious reminder to all the faithful of their responsibility to do all possible to honor Christ entrusted to us in the Eucharist.

Following the *Lavabo* is a prayer which directs the oblation to the Holy Trinity, and then the *Orate fratres* whereby the faithful are bestirred to join their prayers and sacrifices to the prayers and sacrifices present on the altar. Next, comes the celebrant's prayer called the Secret. This prayer derives its name from the Latin word for quiet, *secretum*. The quiet of this prayer and the quiet of the Canon should remind us of when Christ departed from His disciples to pray alone. Along with the *Orate fratres*, we can see the same dynamic at work as was present at the Garden of Olives. He exhorted His disciples to pray, but left them alone while He prayed to the Father, "If it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet not what I will but what you will." (Mt 26: 39, 41)

The preceding prayers of the offertory have been in silence because they are the private prayers of the priest. He has been "doing his job" preparing the sacrifice at the altar. However, the prayers of the Secret and the Canon are silent for a different reason. These latter prayers are silent so as to emphasize the mystery which enshrouds them. Even if we could perceive the words being uttered during the Canon with our ears, we should not be so bold as to think that we can comprehend their full spiritual meaning. The device of silence is yet another "veil." A veil meant not merely to hide the sacred, but to point it out and entice the faithful to probe the mystery before them. The silence of the Canon stirs our wonder and excites our pursuit of spiritual realities. ~Fr. O'Brien
