

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Please reflect on this poem by Peter Abelard (†1142) which beautifully sheds light on the Christmas mystery!

- 1. Verbo verbum virgo concipiens, Ex se verus ortus est Oriens, A quo vera diffusa claritas Circum ductas abduxit tenebras.
- 2. Felix dies, dierum gloria, Huius ortus quae vidit gaudia! Felix mater, quae Deum genuit, Felix stella, quae solem peperit!
- 3. Quam beata pauper puerpera, Cuius partus ditavit omnia! Pauper, inquam, sed celsa genere Pontificum et regum sanguine.
- 4. Vitae viam in via peperit, Hospitium non domum habuit, Regum proles et caeli domina Pro cameris intravit stabula.
- 5. Obstetrices in partu deerant, Sed angeli pro eis aderant, Ouorum statim chorus non modica Huius ortus edixit gaudia.
- 6. Defuerunt fortassis balnea, Sed, quam lavent, non erat macula, Non est dolor, quam illa relevent, Nec scissura, quam illa reparent.
- 7. In excelsis sit. Deo gloria, Pacis nobis in terra foedera, Quam super his voces angelicae Decantasse noscuntur hodie.

- 1. When the virgin conceived by word the word, from her arose the true dawn from the east, from whom the true brightness of day diffused, and did dispel the darkness gathered round.
- 2. How blessed is this day, glory of days, which did behold the joys of this rising. Blessed the mother who brought forth our God, blessed the star that begot the true son.
- 3. How blessed though poor the mother in travail, for by her labor all things she enriched. Poor indeed, I declare, but noble in her birth from stock of priests and from the blood of kings.
- 4. The way to life she brought forth on the way; she rested in an inn and not a house. Offering of kings, and mistress of the heavens, instead of rooms she quartered in a stable.
- 5. There were no midwives present at the birth, but angels were there to lend help instead. Large choirs among them then burst into song, and did proclaim the joys of this rising.
- 6. Perhaps there was no water to be found. but no stain was there for water to cleanse. There was no pain that water might relieve, no tearing of the flesh it might repair.
- 7. In the highest to God let glory be, a covenant of peace to us on earth. Which to us men upon this blessed day angelic voices, as we know, have sung.
