





SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Today, allow me to resume my reflections on A Forest of Symbols from Dom Barth. We reach now the beginning of the Canon of the Mass. This part of the Mass has had several names and each indicate one facet of its significance. Commonly today called the "Eucharistic Prayer," it used to be known as the Actio indicating that the work or the effect of the Mass is contained most fundamentally within its utterances. It was also called "The Secret." Today we call only the priest's prayer before the preface "The Secret," but there was a time when the silence of the Canon was a defining characteristic. "Secret" here refers not to hiddenness, but to its silence. Another term used for the Canon was the "sanctuary." If the parts of the Mass can be likened to a visible structure like the Jewish Temple, the Canon is the Holy of Holies where the divine presence can be found. Just as the High Priest of the Jewish Temple entered alone into the Holy of Holies, so too in the Mass does the Priest stand alone before God praying in silence and solitude on behalf of God's people.

As the Canon begins, you will notice a dramatic gesture by the priest which combines nearly all of the other gestures he makes at other times in the Mass. Before the first words of the Canon, the priest raises his eyes to the cross while extending and arching his hands. Then, in a continuous motion, he bows profoundly placing his folded hands on the altar. He then recites the first few words of the Canon, kisses the altar and makes the first signs of the cross over the oblata.

Notice too that the prayer of the Canon is addressed to God the Father (*Te igitur clementissime Pater*—To You therefore most merciful Father) and prayed in the name of Christ who is the One being offered (*Per Iesum Christum...*). The priest speaks in the third person plural which indicates a formalism needed that we mere humans should mutter before the majesty of God almighty. Saying "we pray," "we offer," etc. also demonstrates that the priest is praying on behalf of all those attending the Mass, indeed, even all the members of the Body of Christ.

Now that we see the initial gestures, and the qualities of the speech used by the priest, let's take a note of the general outline of the Canon. All the prayers of the Canon (from the Preface to the Pater Noster) can be seen to fit into an A-B-A structure. The first part Barthe calls intercessio in this part is the consecration of the Sacred Species, the next part he calls the most important and labels it petitio. The remaining prayers turn again to intercessio. The two times of intercessio ask for grace and blessings for the Church and for the people, while the prayers of petitio specifically connect our requests to the Sacrifice made present on the altar. To offer a vast oversimplification, the prayers of the Canon are accomplishing two things: asking of God what we need (intercessio) and making known to Him why He should listen to us, namely because the Sacrifice present on the altar (petito). ~Fr.
