

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Returning once more to our reflections on the Holy Mass, we resume just after the consecration of the Precious Blood. The apex of the Canon is the moment of consecration, but in order to understand the Canon (and indeed, the Mass as a whole) the next sequence of prayers is vital to reflect on. To the average parishioner in the pew, the high points of the Mass may appear to be the consecration and the moment they receive Holy Communion. Surely, these are pivotal moments of the Mass, but alone they do not capture the whole essence. It's a bit like saying that owning a car is comprised of putting in gas and starting the engine. But until you put it in drive and press the accelerator, you still do not grasp the purpose of the machine.

With my analogy in mind, we can resume Dom Barthe's reflections at the prayer, *Unde et memores*. This prayer, which immediately follow the elevation of the chalice, he calls the culmination of the Canon. At this moment the priest, now standing before the newly transubstantiated Eucharistic elements, the real presence of God, utters words of utmost importance. He begins with a remembrance, or *anamnesis*. In the consecration we heard, "Do this in remembrance of me." Now, we remember Christ's work explicitly: His passion, resurrection and ascension.

The Mass in its essence is expressed in this prayer, the *Unde et memores*. Our remembrance is not only an intellectual exercise, but a sacramental one. Barthe writes, "The Mass is essentially and in practice an efficacious but unbloodied recollection of the passion." The notable word here is "efficacious." The Mass is not only a remembrance, but a remembrance that "effects," or brings about, what it remembers. We see this explicitly when the priest reaches the word "offerimus." The *Unde et memores* prayer following the Canon is one single sentence bound together by the verb "offer."

The act of offering was the work of Christ which purchased our salvation, specifically He offered His suffering and death in the flesh out of love for us. Leaving us the gift of the Eucharist, He empowered His priests not only to consecrate the Eucharist, but also to put engage the full power of His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity by making of the Eucharist a sacrifice to the Father salvation. At the Mass, the priest stands in the place of Christ, as both consecrator of bread and wine into Body and Blood, but also as "sacrificer," offering the Body and Blood to the Father for the remission of sins.

Take a moment to notice how emphatic the prayer is regarding just what is being offered to the Father, "this pure victim, this holy victim, this spotless victim, the holy Bread of eternal life, and the chalice of everlasting salvation." By calling the Eucharistic elements a "victim," it is made clear, the Lord gives us His real presence in the Eucharist so that He may both dwell among us, and bring into our time the events of His self-oblation. These words are accompanied by 5 signs of the cross made by the priest. These symbolize His 5 wounds. They also further serve to emphasize and set our focus on the mystery before our very eyes. Literarily, these signs of the cross form a chiasm with a prayer said before the Canon, the *Quam oblationem*. What was prayed for in that prayer, is now answered in the *Unde et memores*. ~Fr. O'Brien
