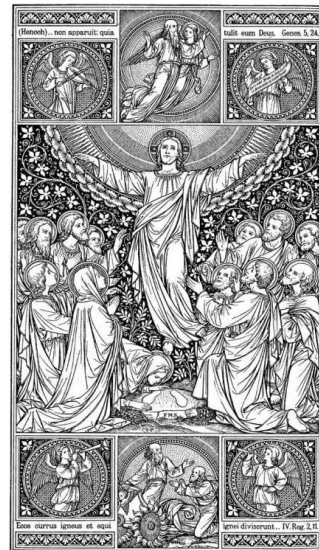

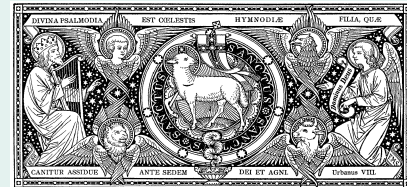

SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Following the *Unde et memores*, Abbé Barthe reflects with us on the next prayer of the Roman Canon, the *Supra quae*. This prayer continues to emphasize the sacrificial nature of the act. In this prayer, the historical context of salvation history is recalled by means of Abel, Abraham and Melchizedek. This triple typology reminds us that sacrifice has been an essential part of the relationship between God and man. Our attention is drawn to these sacrifices of old so as to make clear that the present sacrifice (that of Christ) surpasses these rituals and fulfills them.

In Abel, we recall the pure-hearted offering which pleased God because the gift was the very best of Abel's labors. In Abraham, we recall the trustful surrender of the sacrifice. Isaac was not only Abraham's only son, but he was the sole channel for God's promise to be fulfilled. Yet, trustingly, Abraham was willing to make the sacrifice. Here, we also have an image of resurrection, in that Isaac's life was spared because of Abraham's great act of faith. In Melchizedek, we see a mysterious offering of bread and wine. This offering connects the gift of bread and wine to a particularly priestly act (setting the stage for the Last Supper). And, because Melchizedek's origins were not known, we recognize in him a figure of Christ who is both of earth and of heaven; He is both the priest and the "spotless victim."

Next, the rubrics instruct the priest to bow profoundly with his hands folded on the altar while he prays the *Supplices te rogamus*. This prayer ends with a conclusion, "per dominum nostrum Iesum Christum. Amen." This signifies the end of a thematic section of the Canon, which Barthe calls the *epiclesis*, that is, a moment that calls upon divine contact. Before the consecration, the *epiclesis* asks the Holy Spirit to descend upon the gift to make them Holy. In this prayer, the "holy Angel" is invoked to take the sacrifice up to God, thus uniting our altar with the heavenly altar.

Many have commented on who the "Angel" is as named in this prayer. Durandus, of the 13th century, identifies this Angel as, "the Angel of great Counsel, the Counsellor on whose advice God created and recreated the world," which is another way of saying Christ, the Word-incarnate. This interpretation is also found in St. Thomas Aquinas. Truly, the union of our altar to the "altar on high" refers to that eternal offering of self which is forever carried out by Christ to the Father. At the Father's right hand, the crucified and risen Lord forever intercedes for us, and that very act of intercession is made present before our eyes. The deep bow of the priest at this moment reflects awe before the mystery that on the altar is not only the Body and Blood of the God-man, Christ, but also His very sacrifice placed before us anew. How powerful this moment, therefore, to stir Christ's gift of peace in us! In the Eucharist we find a divine companion, an eternal advocate, and Him who continuously takes upon Himself our own consequences so that we may be forever one with God! It is a gift beyond our ability to ask; it is the deepest essence of the Mass!
