SERVITE DOMINUM IN TIMORE

Let us continue with Dcn. Uhlich's reflections on the diaconate. We arrive at his section relating the chalice to the ministry of the deacon, a link displayed since very early in the Church's life. This is not a mere practical association, but it is, rather, emblematic of the deacon's ministry. Eastern and Western traditions are united about this point; the priest consecrates, the deacon assists to mediate the Sacrament to the faithful. This expression of hierarchy shows the beauty of diversity and unity in the Body of Christ.

The long-time association of the deacon with the chalice, and its consistency throughout Christendom indicate that the service of the chalice is an ordinary expectation of the deacon's ministry. Recall the early patristic sources that have given witness to this: Justin Martyr, the *Didascalia*, and Hippolytus to name the earliest sources.

These deep-rooted traditions arrive to our own day by means of the liturgical rubrics for the deacon at the classical form of the Roman Rite. According to the 1962 *Missale Romanum*, the deacon is to prepare the chalice with wine, then to place his hand upon it while the priest and deacon pray the offertory prayer together. The deacon, therefore is seen as a co-offerer with the priest. This action shows that the deacon shares in the sacramental character granted by Holy Orders permitting him such intimate access to the altar of God. It also correlates to the uniquely 'diaconal' aspect of his rank, namely, to display Christ the servant by mediating the chalice for the faithful. He is united to the assembly by standing as their servant; he is united to the priesthood by his sacred duty at the altar.

In this way, we can see the deacon as the New Testament fulfillment of the Old Testament Levite. To the Levites it belonged to guard the Ark of the Covenant with awe and reverence. Just so, the vessel of the New Covenant in Christ's Blood is guarded and revered by today's deacons.

In the Byzantine tradition, the deacon has a role assisting in the fraction of the hosts and the distribution of the Precious Blood. That same tradition confers Holy Orders upon new deacons right after the consecration of the Eucharist, instructing the deacon to take his place at the altar and to immediately assist at the chalice. Syriac and Armenian traditions contain similar elements.

In the history of the Roman Rite, the deacon would wash his hands during the Canon so as to be prepared to assist with the chalice at the minor elevation. At one time, the deacon was also called upon during the fraction of the host.

Medieval errors made their way into the minds of the faithful. Some began to believe that the Eucharist must be received under the forms of both Consecrated Bread and Consecrated Wine in order to receive the whole Sacrament. The work of St. Thomas Aquinas and the later decrees of the Council of Trent clarified that the whole of the Sacrament is present in either form alone. To cement this truth in the minds of the faithful, Trent also issued directives eliminating the distribution of the chalice to the assembly. While this instruction was beneficial for true doctrine, some perceive that it softened the liturgical role of the deacon and his connection to the ministry of the chalice. Nonetheless, what remains of the deacon's liturgical role is the resonance of our long tradition: the service of the chalice is the embodiment of our theology of the diaconate. ~Fr. O'Brien
